Rights Respecting School

Berrymede Junior School is a Rights Respecting School, which means that the UN Convention on the Rights of a Child is at the heart of what we do. Everyone uses the rights respecting language. Our children are taught to distinguish between “wants” and “needs” and they have a strong voice in the classroom which enhances teaching and learning.

We believe that pupils perform better when the home and school work together in partnership.

To achieve our aims and support our home-school agreement, the School will:
