Swimming: In year 6 currently, we have 34% of children able to swim 25m competently in a range of strokes. Through the swimming curriculum, the children also learn lifesaving skills such as treading water and self-rescue. Catch up programs will run in in September 2021 due to covid-19 lockdowns.

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
